- 50,000 ha of prime floodplains is densely infested
- 200,000 ha of native grasslands is immediately at risk of being dominated by mesquite


Mesquite (*Prosopis* species)

Pods elongated, straw to purple in colour



Plant grows in a shrubby whippy shape



Stem is smooth with toothpick-like thorns


Mimosa Bush (Acacia farnesiana)



Flowers round & yellow



Pods small and black



Plant grows in a distinct V shape



Stem has prominent white spots with needle-like thorns
